August 3: "Doubt is Not Our Product" -Rev. Aaron White. Recently, the UUA has been placing ads in Time Magazine promoting our congregations and their unique message. One such advertisement on April 14th read, 'When in doubt, pray. When in prayer, doubt.' For many years, Unitarian Universalists have prided ourselves on being able to bring our doubts to church. Are there some things, though, that we should not let doubt rule? August 10: "Something, Anything More" - Rev. Aaron White. The well known software engineer, Fred Brooks, once commented that projects become a year behind schedule 'one day at a time.' Is it possible that the same is true of our lives and of our religion? In his essay, Prudence, the former Unitarian minister, Ralph Waldo Emerson exclaimed, 'How much of human life is lost in waiting!' What great life inside us are we putting off for tomorrow that could be lived today?

August 17: "To Love Alike" -Rev. Aaron White. In 1568, the world's first law of religious toleration was put into place by the first and only Unitarian king, John Sigismund of Transylvania. About this cherished diversity of the spirit, his court minister, Francis David, famously noted, 'We need not think alike to love alike.' I have heard in a number of Unitarian Universalist circles that our communities are shaped, not by what we believe, but by what we love. Our Universalist ancestors might have turned that around, saying that we are defined by what loves us. In this month's theme sermon, and my final sermon as your summer minister, we will be exploring the notion of love. What is it that we as a community love? What might it be like to live with the assumption of our Universalist past, that we live in the midst of a love so strong that it will never leave us?

August 24: "Things to Do in Church When You're Dead" - Rev. Fred Wooden is the Senior Minister of the Fountain Street Church in Grand Rapids, Michigan, an independent and nondenominational liberal church since 1960. He is a fourth generation Unitarian who has served four UU churches between 1980 and 2005 when he went to Grand Rapids. Among them was this church, from 1990-1994.

August 31: "To Come Alive" Dr. Davidson Loehr - In addition to the monthly "theme" sermons. I want to do a series on what's unique and important to us about arising from within the Protestant tradition, and especially the very liberal wing of it. There aren't any creeds to learn. That's part of the deal - only a few principles and ideals. But those are both important and life-giving (and sometimes very challenging). This Sunday is the first: a very broad introduction to the fundamental spirit of Protestantism, which is still relevant today. Hint: what exactly were they "protesting"?





